

Homespun Rag Quilt

Sunshine and Shadow Pattern

64" x 80"

Fabric Requirements:

5 Homespun Fabrics – 2 ¼ yards each

Lining

54" Wide Flannel - 3 ¼ yards or Twin size Cotton Batting.

Cutting:

Cut – 8 – 9 ½" Strips of each Fabric.

Cut Again into 9 ½" x 9 ½" Squares.

You will have **32** of each color. *(this is enough for the front and the back)*

Cut Flannel or Batting into 7 ½" Squares. You will need 80 squares.

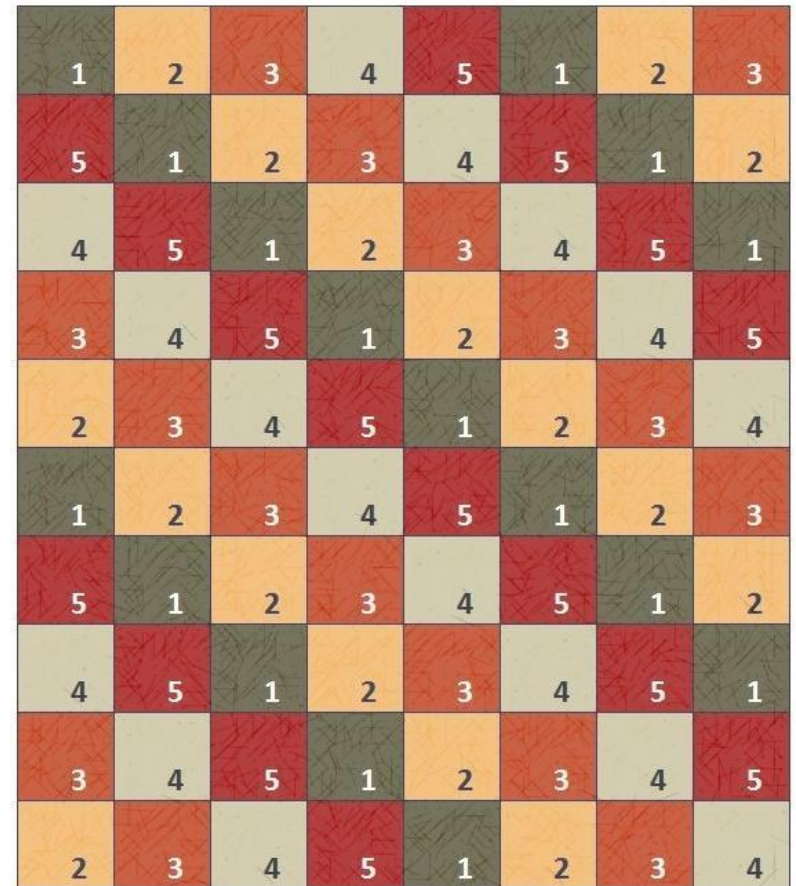

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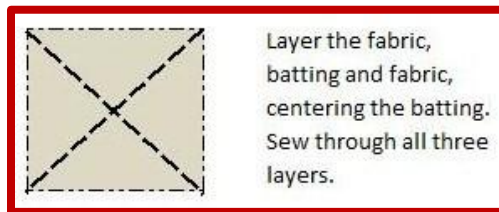

Homespun Rag Quilt Construction:

1. Making the Blocks

Using 2 of the same Homespun Fabrics and one piece of batting (or flannel batting), sandwich them together with the batting in the middle and the wrong sides of the homespun toward the batting. Center the batting. Sew from 1 corner to the opposite corner, through all 3 layers, to machine quilt an X as shown.

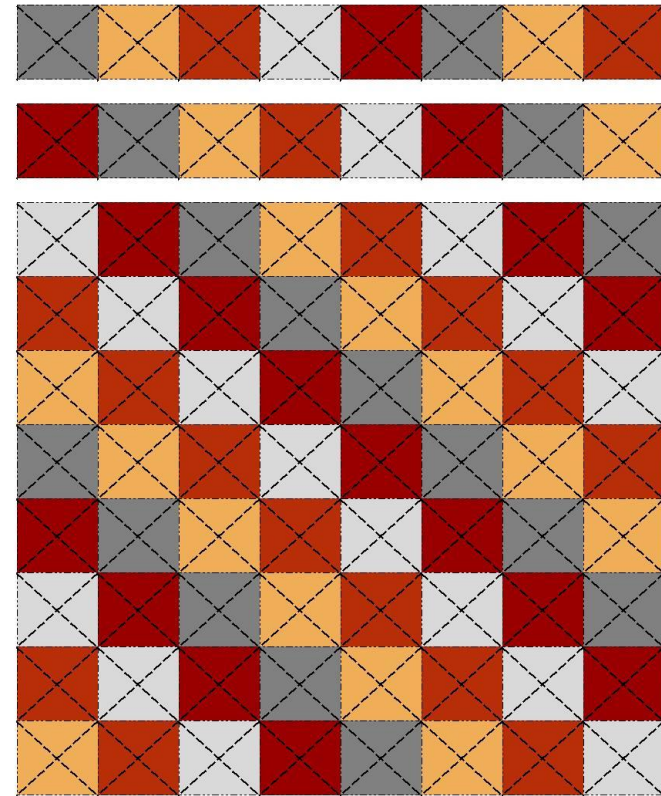


2. Arrange the blocks in the pattern shown. Sunshine and Shadow. The same pattern will be on the back when completed.
3. Sew the quilt together using large seams. Seam width is up to you. Quiltmakers have had success with $\frac{1}{2}$ " , $\frac{3}{4}$ " and 1" seam allowance. For your first quilt we recommend the larger seams.
4. Sew quilt together in rows. Sew ends to finish.

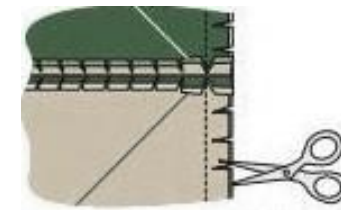


Sew blocks together in rows using 1" or large seams.

5. Join Rows pinning at the intersections.



6. Clip around each block taking care not to cut into the seams.



7. Take outdoors and shake well. Wash and dry in the washing machine and dryer. Empty lint screen often.
